She explained she had bought these items at her friend, Christine Good-Smith's fundraiser, which took place at Christine's home in Connecticut. The premise of the fundraiser was for people to



donate new or slightly used items which Christine collected and then hosted a fundraiser evening where friends came to "Shop for a Cause." Everyone paid a \$20 suggested donation at the door and then each item could be purchased for \$5... this lead to my "Shopping for Causes Event" on Thursday, May 30th!

This year we decided to have our First Annual Rockaway WISH Ladies Brunch to recognize a few of the amazing women in our community. We are privileged to live in a neighborhood where people care about each other and help others in times of need. This was truly evidenced after Hurricane Sandy ravaged our town. So many people stepped up to help even when they were struggling themselves. WISH stands for Women Inspired to Support and Help and this year we wanted to acknowledge three women who epitomized what WISH is all about during our neighborhood's greatest time of need. We honor, admire, and congratulate these women:

Meghan Flanagan - When Hurricane Sandy hit Meghan did not waste anytime, she was part of the group who began the donation center at SFDS, helping to organize hundreds of volunteers and thousands of donations. She later worked tirelessly at the BHYC donation center, while constantly reaching out to her numerous contacts to secure generous donations of goods, food, and money to help her Rockaway neighbors. Due to her grant writing Rockaway WISH acquired our Robin Hood grant, Mrs. Redmond's playground was rebuilt, and many other companies donated goods to our donation center. She helped to organize the many uplifting community events at the BHYC after the storm and she continues to work hard everyday to ensure that the Rockaway community is supported and not forgotten.

Marybeth Bevacqua - Immediately after Sandy Marybeth began assisting her neighbors, walking around Breezy with her daughters handing out gift cards to those in need. She was integral in obtaining donations to fill the Breezy supply center and to line the main road with American flags. Marybeth also helped to organize playground rebuilds and a relief concert in Bay Ridge. During this time she realized that because families were struggling, children might miss out on special milestones and "Operation Seniors" was born. She acquired donations of formal attire and make-up and hair appointments for the proms, as well as monetary donations to assist families paying for senior dues and college applications. Marybeth recently moved back to Breezy and will surely continue to do what she can to help her neighbors.

Stephanie Wagner - After the storm, Stephanie helped with various relief efforts in Broad Channel. She immediately began the Broad Channel Relief Page to raise funds from outside sources for her fellow Broad Channel residents. Her website raised over \$18,000, including a \$5000 donation from PC Richards, which she turned into gift cards that she distributed throughout the neighborhood. When the holidays rolled around she wanted to ensure that the people of Broad Channel were filled with the Christmas Spirit. She felt that the lights would also bring joy to the people of Rockaways who had been driving home on a dark and desolate Cross Bay Boulevard for two months. She raised the money and hired a company to light up Broad Channel, a beautiful tradition that she continued this year for our enjoyment.



On November 3rd, five Rockaway women crossed the finish line at the ING NYC Marathon, not only accomplishing an incredible feat of physical endurance, but also helping to support Rockaway WISH in our efforts to help the Rockaway community.
